Being back in Togo stirred up deep emotions; it's heavy on our hearts amid the turmoil in West Africa, with political unrest and security concerns affecting so many. Despite getting the flu and a scary bus accident that left me shaken, the trip was worth every moment. God showed up powerfully as we trained local leaders and encouraged the church.

Our dear friends Joseph and Patricia, the chaplains at Hope Radio, have faithfully carried on the ministry baton we passed when we left. Lamboni came to faith just recently this year and invited our team into his village to share the Gospel. It's not been easy

with been persecution and rejection, as you can imagine in a community steeped in voodoo. But God is breaking through! As the attached picture shows, a group of over 40 people is now committing their lives to Christ and gathering for worship. This work is being carried out by the Togolese without missionary involvement. Our team has poured into the chaplains and they are pouring into others in villages. This is the
